Korean studies in Hungary

- □ overall picture
- Korean studies is a relatively new field of study in Hungary
- Its formal framework was established in the 2000s
- Currently, it is one of the most popular fields within the humanities, with two universities offering Korean studies.



Korean studies in Hungary – short history 1.

- first cultural and political contacts at the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries
- travellers' accounts and photo collections of cultural and historical value
 - Vay Péter (1863–1948)
 - Baráthosi Balogh Benedek (1871–1957)
 - Bozóky Dezső (1871–1957)

Korean studies in Hungary – short history 2.

- establishment of diplomatic relations with the DPRK in 1948
- during and after the Korean War:
 - hospital and factory buildings
 - medical teams and engineers working in North Korea
 - North Korean orphans and students arrive in Hungary
 - literary translation begins, Korean language book and Hungarian-Korean dictionary are produced
 - work of Aladár Sövény (1914–1980)




Korean studies in Hungary – short history 3.

beginning of the 1970s: easing of diplomatic relations with North Korea

- book donations to the university
- exchange of scholarship students
 - Mártonfi Ferenc (1945– 1991) linguist, sinologist
 - Osváth Gábor (1946–) linguist, translator

Korean studies at ELTE

- 1970s: Korean language courses
- 1997: 2-year Korean program supervised by Ágnes Birtalan (head of the Dept. of Inner Asian Studies); book donations of Korea Foundation
- middle of 2000's: Korean minor progam
- 2008: establishment of the Korean Department (BA program)
- 2013: Korean studies MA program
- 2018: Korean studies doctoral programme
- number of newly admitted students: slight upward trend year by year until 2020; a sharp increase from 2020 onwards

The Korean Collection: Introduction

Overview

The Korean Collection is part of the Institute of East Asian Studies Library at Eötvös Loránd University (ELTE), integrated within the ELTE Library Network (EKSZ). https://eltekonyvtarak.elte.hu/en/university-library-service

■ Importance

Although not an independent institution, it plays a crucial role in supporting Korean Studies at the Faculty of Humanities of ELTE.



Institute of East Asian Studies Library: composition and challenges

- •Holdings: cca. 50,000 volumes
- •Multi-collection Structure: The library includes Japanese, Chinese, Korean, Southeast Asian, Mongolian, Tibetan, and Buddhist collections, spread across four rooms in two buildings.
- •Challenges: The dispersed nature and lack of resources (money, space, staff) complicate the management and development of these collections

The Korean Collection

- ☐ Historical Background
 - The collection began with 200–300 volumes donated by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea in the 1970s
 - from the late 1990s: donation of the Korea Foundation
 - 2008: the collection includes cca. 1200 volumes
 - 2019: Window on Korea Project (WOK)
 - May 2025: renewal of WOK MOU
- ☐ Current Status
 - Today the Korean collection holds 5,470 documents



Window on Korea (WOK) Project

The first WOK project has been implemented between 2019-2024 with the broad collaboration of teachers, students and the librarian.

- Documents selected by faculty members
- Accessioning and shelving involving student volunteers
- Cataloguing by student workers (2020-2022)



Window on Korea (WOK) Project

■ Results

- •library expanded with new premise and furnishings
- •collection multiplied (1200→5470 volumes)
- •the entire Korean collection retrospectively catalogued by the end if 2023
- •increase of the number of loans of Korean materials
- special course on the documents of WOK collection
